

All Saint's Church at Wighton

It's very exciting to be curating the first NNEP exhibition at Wighton Church.

As an introduction to the new venue, I have put together a mini walk-around with some images along with my first impressions and areas of interest, for artists to consider. I do however recommend artists visit to take their inspiration from All Saints Church at Wighton.

The church is located on Kirkgate Lane and benefits from a wonderful high position overlooking the fields of North Norfolk, this position creates a beautiful light inside. With minimal stained glass windows, the light is bright, warm and natural.

All Saints Church have been very welcoming, all areas of the church can be used, but of course, respecting the historic building (nothing new can be fixed to the walls)

There are some pre-existing nails that could be considered, but exhibition screens can be used for 2D works, both aisles are a great width, and could be used to display a combination of sculpture and 2D work.

Overhead the centre aisle are huge beams which could be used to suspend work from. An unmissable feature of this church is from standing at the end of the aisle and looking back toward the wall is an enormous open wall space.

There are also many interesting nooks and spaces that can be considered.

Outside there is a lot of green space all around the church for external works including a very interesting conservation area which feels like a place to be discovered.
